AGM Recap: Celebrating Together!

Our recent Annual General Meeting was a wonderful opportunity for volunteers, learners, trustees, and staff to come together, reflect on the past year, and celebrate the impact of SAVTE.

The meeting began with a warm welcome from **Nuhu**, our link worker, who encouraged attendees to connect with one another and reflect on their personal journeys with SAVTE. He invited everyone to answer questions such as what connects them to SAVTE and their favourite places in Sheffield, creating a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. This opening activity helped bring people together and highlighted the diverse experiences and shared sense of belonging within our community.

From Isolation to Opportunity- Nessar's story

Nessar, originally from Yemen, was introduced to his SAVTE volunteer, Trevor, in the summer of 2024. Newly settled in Sheffield and living near the city centre, Nessar spoke a little English but lacked confidence and felt socially isolated.

He was determined to improve his English and build a life in the UK so he could support his family.

Trevor and Nessar quickly formed a close friendship, and Nessar often expresses his gratitude for Trevor's support.

In spring 2025, Nessar's family joined him in Sheffield. The family has settled well, and the children have adjusted to school and nursery. The whole family has been supported through English sessions, games, and storytelling.

Nessar now hopes to join a SAVTE Conversation Group and aims to attend an ESOL class in 2026. Plans are also underway to match a female volunteer with his wife, Haifa, to help her build a life in Sheffield alongside her family.

Learning, Living, Belonging - Najwa's story

When Linda Baxter met Najwa in February, she found a young Sudanese mother in Sheffield who knew only the English alphabet and numbers. Isolated at home with her son Mohammed, Najwa felt lost in a new world.

Linda didn't just teach English she taught life. From using the Lidl app and joining the library to preparing for the Life in the UK test, she made learning practical and inclusive, even bringing materials for little Mohammed.

The result? Najwa passed her citizenship test, shops independently, attends English classes, and explores Sheffield's parks with confidence.

Najwa says

When Linda came, she made me feel happy, as if she is family... now I feel it is easy

From “just sitting home” to embracing her new community this is what happens when a volunteer sees beyond language barriers to the person within.

Important Updates for All Volunteers

IMPORTANT

1- Changes to Travel Expense Claims

Starting March 2026, we will be updating our process for volunteer reimbursements. To ensure our records are accurate and transparent, we will be asking all volunteers to submit **travel tickets** or **digital receipts** alongside their expense claims.

We know this is a change to the usual routine, so we want to make the transition as smooth as possible:

- **Guided Support:** We will be providing hands-on support and walkthroughs to show you exactly how to capture and upload your tickets. This will be available through your link workers.
- **Policy Update:** Our Volunteer Expenses Policy will be updated to reflect these changes, providing clear guidance on what is required. We will share this with you soon.
- **Here to Help:** If you aren't tech-savvy or have concerns about the new process, don't worry we'll make sure you're comfortable with the steps before the March start date.

Snapshots: Winter 2025

• English Skills My Health

The new community ESOL class 'English Skills My Health' has got off to a great start with 14 learners attending regularly at Darnall Wellbeing. Learners are developing vocabulary and confidence to communicate with medical professionals and make choices about health issues.

Many learners told us they would like to practise using online forms to manage health care so the class is also focusing on these digital skills.

• Stronger Together Event

On 16 October 2025, SAVTE brought together city leaders from the council, charity, and business sectors with our English Conversation group at the City of Sanctuary. Learners shared their experiences of attending SAVTE sessions and the positive impact on themselves and Sheffield.

In November 25, responding to learner demand in the area, SAVTE set up a new Conversation Group at Parson Cross in partnership with Parson Cross Initiative.



The group is led by 2 of our new volunteers Razia and Jo and is well attended by around 12 learners weekly. We look forward to developing more provision in the area soon.

• SAVTE in Action: Voices Heard, Barriers Tackled

On 18 November 2025, **Healthwatch Sheffield** joined a SAVTE Conversation group at Pat Midgley Community Hub to gather feedback on barriers to accessing dental care on the Gleadless estate.

Learners, volunteers, and medical students worked together to share experiences and insights. SAVTE tutors supported the session by explaining new words and helping participants fully engage in discussions and surveys, turning the visit into a learning experience as well as an opportunity to make their voices heard, showing exactly how SAVTE empowers people through connection and learning.

Healthwatch Sheffield at SAVTE (Sheffield Association for the Voluntary Teaching of English) Conversation group

Healthwatch Sheffield gathers people's views on health and social care in Sheffield and shares them with decision makers, to inform improvements. On Tuesday 18th November 2025, we went to **SAVTE Conversation group at Pat Midgley Community Hub** - a free, informal English language practice group for non-native speakers run by **SAVTE**, to help adults build confidence and skills in speaking and listening through social interaction, often serving as a stepping stone to formal classes. At our visit, we spoke to the students and their tutors who were volunteers, about their experiences with **health and social care services** in Sheffield.

The Conversation group tutors supported the session by identifying new or unfamiliar words within the questions we used. They wrote these words on the board and explained their meanings to the group, helping to ensure participants could fully understand the questions and engage confidently in both the discussion and surveys, as well as learn new words.
